Cyber Bullying and Online Safety

- ▶ For all grade levels Pre-K through 12th grade
- -Online safety rules for our Elementary age students

We will teach and review four online safety rules for our elementary age students that support positive digital citizenship.

-Child exploitation and Grooming topics shared in the older aged students (middle school and High school).

These topics go more in depth to the consequences and state laws that try to keep our youth safe and away from child exploitation. Positive digital citizenship is also covered with our older students.

What is Cyber Bullying?

Defined as:

"willful and repeated harm inflicted through the use of computers, cell phones, and other electronic devices."

referring to incidents where adolescents use technology to harass, threaten, humiliate, or otherwise hassle their

peers or others.

Consequences of Cyberbullying

Not a Rite of Passage

In most states, bullying <u>and</u> cyberbullying are against school policy and state law.



- Not allowed to participate in certain school activities
- Suspension

Legally you may face charges:

You could be criminally charged with harassment or stalking



Long-term implications:

It could limit your ability to receive certain scholarships or secure certain jobs

Charges Brought against a couple involved in Cyber bullying



Social Media and Future Impacts:


- Once something is sent out through internet it can not be completely deleted or vanish.

inere nave been recent reports tracsome seemingly innocent videos on YouTube and YouTube Kids (such as 'surprise eggs', unboxing videos and Minecraft videos) have been edited by unknown sources to include violence provoking and/or other inappropriate content. Even though YouTube monitor and remove videos that include inappropriate content, clips can be uploaded and viewed thousands of times

Popular YouTubers and other accounts have Some of the videos include a disclosure message warning that the content may be "inappropriate or offensive to some audiences" and that "viewer discretion is advised" but these videos are still easily ccessed by clicking 'I understand and wis to proceed'. The image of the 'Momo' character can be deeply distressing to children and young people and it's important to note that it may slip through parental settings and filters.

Why does it happen?

GOING ONLINE MANES IT EASIER FOR PEOPLE TO SAY AND DO THINGS THEY PROBABLY WOULDN'T DO FACE TO FACE, ONLINE DAMAGE THAT THEY ARE DOING, QUITE OFTEN, PEOPLE BULLY BECAUSE THEY ARE GOING THROUGH SOMETHING DIFFICULT THEMSELVES AND TAHING IT OUT ON OTHERS IS THE ONLY WAY THEY KNOW HOW TO GET CONTROL OF THEIR OWN EMOTIONS.

CHAT ROOMS OR BLOGS, AND AVOID FURTHER COMMUNICATION WITH THOSE SENDING THE MESSAGES. KEEP AWARE OF FAHE PROFILES AND INTERNET USERS
