## What is NSBA?



## **NSBA's Advocacy Priorities**

NSBA is about the common challenges facing ALL school board members, whether they reside in our largest cities or our most remote rural areas. Included among these challenges:

- Providing support for historically disadvantaged students.
- Increasing broadband access and closing the homework gap.
- Ensuring that each classroom is staffed with a highly qualified teacher.
- Providing support for students with disabilities and mental health needs.
- Addressing learning recovery as a result of inequities already existing but exacerbated by the pandemic.
