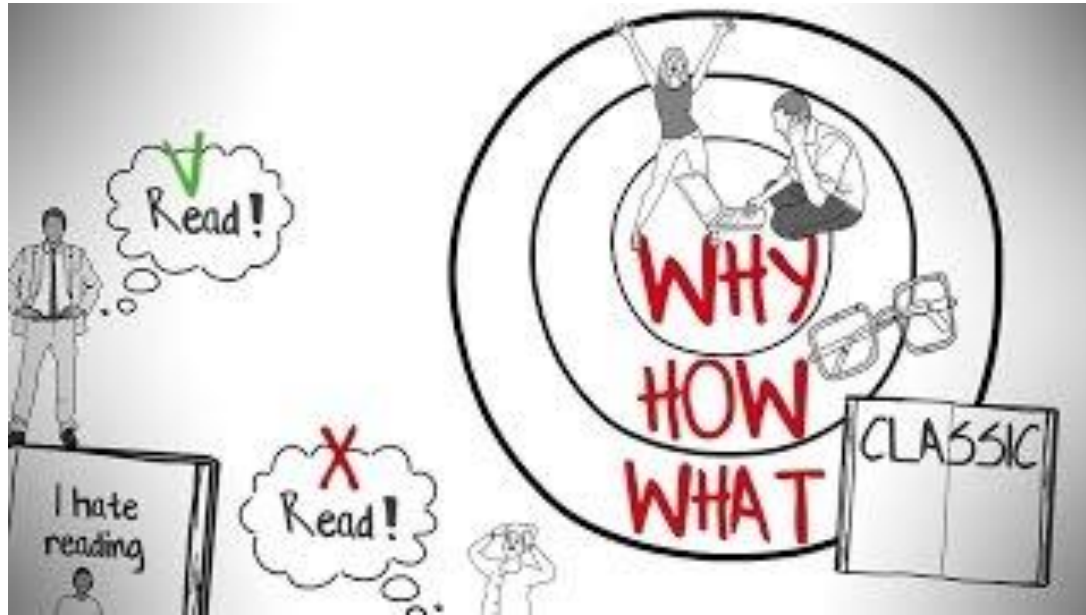

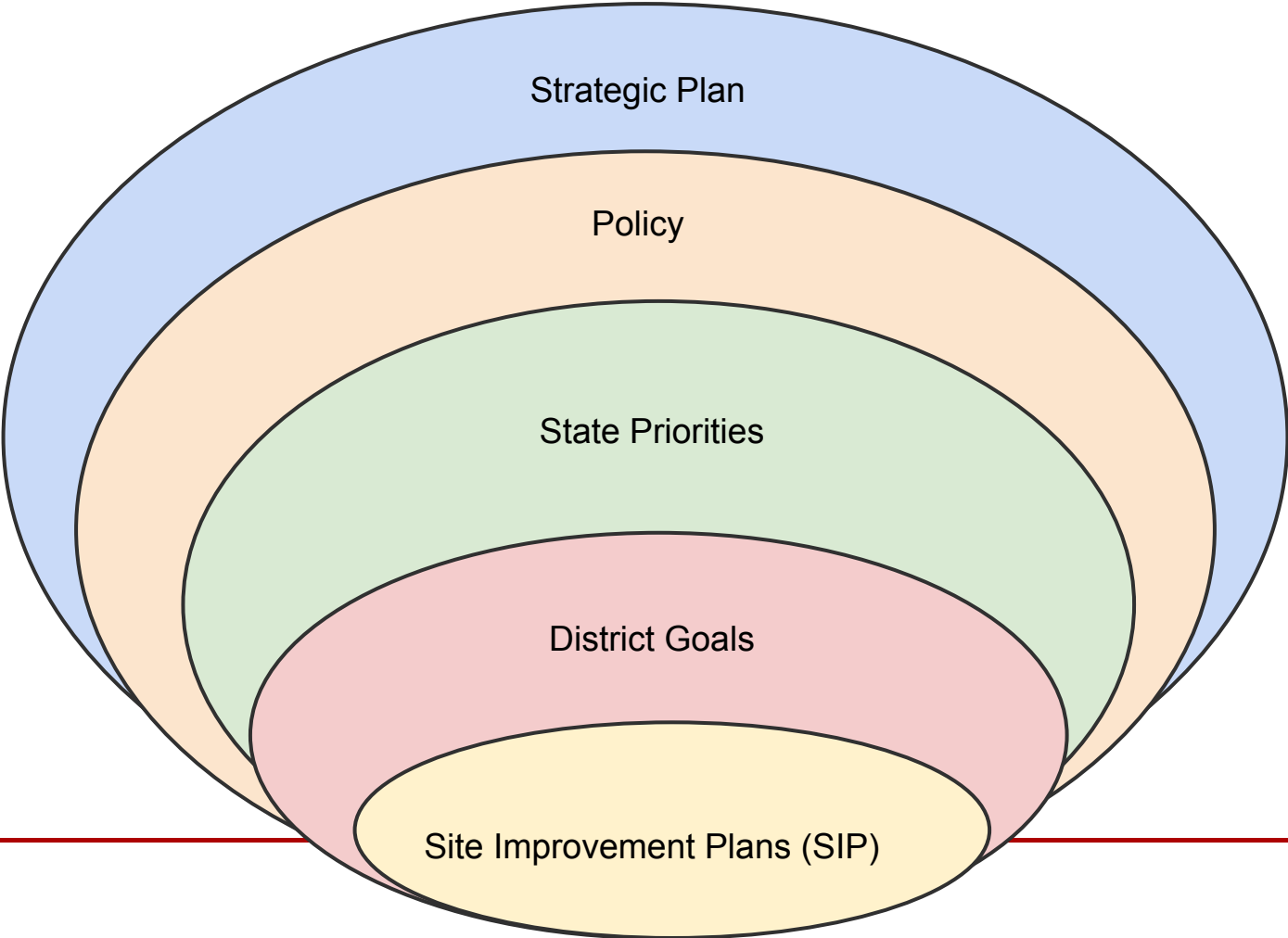

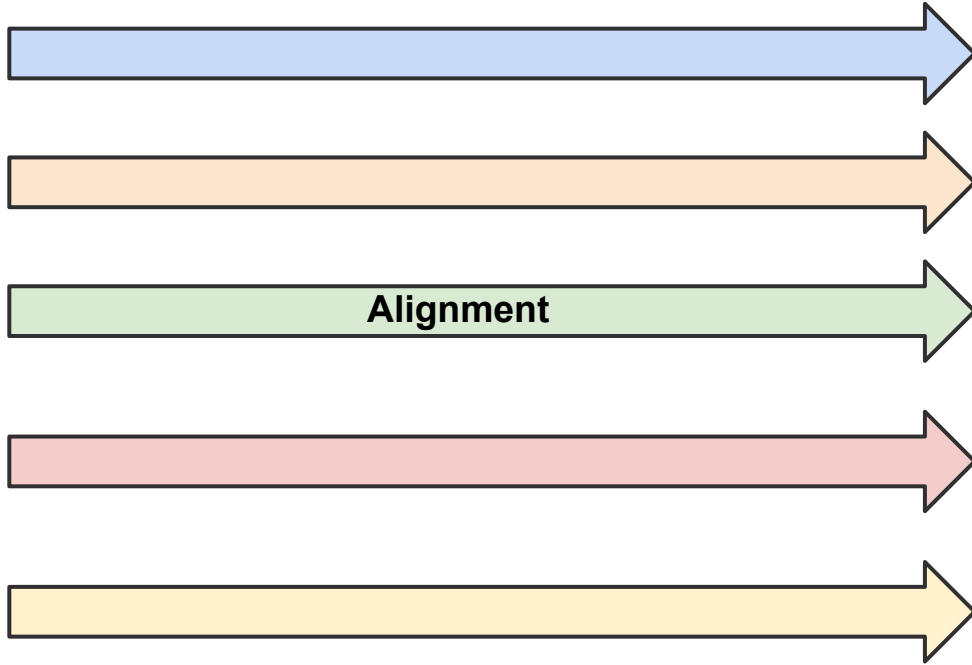

inspire each student to learn continuously so they are empowered to reach personal fulfillment and contribute purposefully to our ever-changing world.

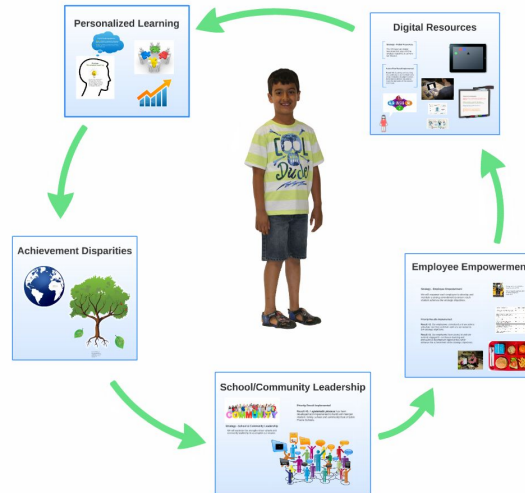
Strategic Objectives

District Goals

1. The percentage of district 272 students who are not proficient in the subject areas (Reading, Math, and Science), measured by the state accountability test will decrease by half across all racial, service, and socio economic groups by 2023.*
 2. The percentage of district 272 students who are not considered college and career ready, as measured by the ACT will decrease by half across all racial, service, and socio economic groups by 2023.*
 3. The percentage of district 272 students who do not graduate in four years will decrease by half across all racial, service, and socio economic groups by 2023.*
 4. Each of our students, regardless of racial, service, or socio economic group, will demonstrate proficiency of 21st Century Skills (4C's) by graduation as measured by the district adopted rubrics.
 5. Each of our students, regardless of racial, service, or socio economic group, will demonstrate proactive engagement in community by graduation.
