Regular Local Elections

November 4, 2025


Held to elect qualified persons to local governing bodies, including school boards.

Non-partisan election (no party or slate).

May include ballot questions (bond or mill levy).

Called, conducted and canvassed pursuant to the Election Code.

- Early and Absentee voting.
- Physical polling locations on election day.




2/14/2025

Special Elections

Held at any time other than a regular election. Called, conducted and canvassed pursuant to the Special Election Act.

- Mail ballot only
- District bears the expense.





2024 General Election

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 1: Proposing an amendment to article 8, section 15 of the constitution of New Mexico to extend a property tax exemption, currently only allowed for one hundred percent disabled veterans and their widows and widowers, to veterans with less than a one hundred percent disability and their widows and widowers and basing the amount of the exemption on a veteran's federal disability rating



CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 2: Proposing an amendment to article 8, section 5 of the constitution of New Mexico to increase a property tax exemption for honorably discharged members of the armed forces and their widows and widowers.



2025 Legislature

HB 47 and SB 192 - Implementing Veteran and Disabled Veteran Exemption

"The nuance tied to the specific individual and individual property make it impossible ... to fully understand the financial impact to their budgets until the exemption is filed." - NM Counties Bill Analysis

"[B]ond capacity will decrease because of veteran exemptions, and...many schools... issue debt periodically ... which may create challenges in servicing debt with reduced revenues." - Fiscal Impact Report

Mill levies subject to yield control or already at or near the maximums may not be able to offset losses. School districts may not be able to adjust debt levies to cover the lost revenue, particularly in the first year or two of implementation. Fiscal Impact Report

Questions on compliance with existing bond covenants.

2025 Legislature

HB 342 - Property Tax Changes – Proposes the implementing changes for the 2024 Constitutional Amendments but also adds a temporary "lightening tax" restriction on <u>non-</u> <u>residential properties</u> to prohibit an increase in excess of 112% over the prior tax year for the years 2025 through 2037.

HB 128 - NMFA Local Solar Access Fund - Proposes establishment of a \$60MM grant program administered by the NMFA for solar energy projects.


Timeline

Election DOs

Plan ahead.

Educate voters using communications that factually describe the purpose of a measure without advocating for or against.

- Bond question and mill levy information.
- Make available election logistics information (polling locations; early voting dates; absentee ballot; clerk and secretary of state websites).



Election DON'Ts

- Do not take an official position on passage of bond or tax elections.
- Board cannot support particular candidates.
- Do not use state or local funds or other district resources to electioneer for or against any candidate, measure or political party.
